Appendix II

Description:

This course will provide in-depth information and hands-on activities to support assessment and intervention of visual-vestibular functioning. Emphasis will be on identifying and improving visual/oculo-motor and vestibular processing difficulties that are related to praxis challenges, especially those impacting bilateral coordination and projected action sequences. Hands on labs and clinical observations will be covered to teach how to assess oculo-motor and vestibular challenges including gravitational insecurity. Intervention strategies to address oculo-motor and vestibular functioning, gravitational insecurity, bilateral coordination skills and projected action sequences will be presented in lecture and hands on labs. The course format will include a combination of lecture, videos and hands on lab activities .

Course Objectives:

The participant will be able to:

- Describe how visual-vestibular dysfunction relates to sensory integration and praxis functioning.
- Identify key components and observations necessary to effectively assess visual-vestibular functions.
- Demonstrate how to administer key oculo-motor and vestibular assessments
- Articulate intervention strategies to address core oculo-motor and visual-vestibular functions
- State at least 3 intervention activities to address each area of visual-vestibular functioning
