Speaker information

Prof. Cecilia W.P. Li-Tsang, Professor PDOT, HKROT, OT(C), MPhil, PhD

Professor Li, is a renowned researcher and expert in the field of Occupational Therapy. She has made significant contributions to the development and utilization of the Smart Handwriting Analysis and Recognition Platform (SHARP).

Prof. Li-Tsang's work on the SHARP assessment tool has involved extensive research, development, and validation. Her expertise in hand function assessment and rehabilitation has been instrumental in advancing the field and improving clinical practice.

Prof Li-Tsang's dedication to advancing the field of Occupational Therapy, particularly in the area of hand function assessment and rehabilitation, has earned her recognition and respect within the profession. Her contributions continue to shape the field and enhance the quality of care provided to individuals with hand-related impairments.

Dr Howard Leung Wing Ho, BEng(McGill), MSc(CMU), PhD(CMU)

Howard Leung is currently an Associate Professor in the Department of Computer Science at City University of Hong Kong. He received the B.Eng. degree in Electrical Engineering from McGill University, Canada, in 1998, the M.Sc. degree and the Ph.D. degree in Electrical and Computer Engineering from Carnegie Mellon University in 1999 and 2003 respectively. Throughout his graduate studies, he was with the Advanced Multimedia Processing Lab.

His current research interests include 3D Human Motion Analysis and Retrieval, Intelligent Tools for Chinese Handwriting Education, Web-Based Learning Technologies and Brain Informatics. He is also supervising the 3D Motion Capture Laboratory. At present, he is the Treasurer of Hong Kong Web Society.



Ms. Calfee Tam, Occupational Therapist I at Hong Kong Red Cross John F. Kennedy Centre

Calfee Tam, received a Professional Diploma in Occupational Therapy at The Hong Kong Polytechnic

University in 1993, and a Master degree in Educational Studies at The University of Queensland in 2000. She has been working in the Hong Kong Red Cross John F. Kennedy Centre (JFKC) which is a special school for children with variety of physical disabilities and medical complications for over 30 years. She is certified in Sensory Integration and Sensory Integration & Praxis Test (SIPT), Evaluation in Ayres Sensory Integration (EASI) and Neuro-developmental Treatment (NDT). She has the expertise in variety of therapeutic approaches such as Handwriting Without Tears®, Therapeutic Listening® and Quickshifts. She completed the Information Course on Conductive Education at the International Peto Institude in Budapest in 1995 and played an important role in promoting the development



and application of Conductive Education in JFKC. She is devoted and has extensive experience in putting clinical skills in practice in management and treatment of children with cerebral palsy and other neuromotor disorders.

Ms. Noel Wang, Occupational Therapist I at Heep Hong Society

Noel Wang has been a pediatric occupational therapist and has extensive working experience in variety of settings, such as NGO (Heep Hong Society), private clinics and mainstream schools, for the last 18 years. 
