Appendix I Speaker Information

Mr. Tony Huang Chun Fat

Mr. Tony Huang graduated from the Hong Kong Polytechnic University with a BSc(Hons) in Occupational Therapy in 2009. He also obtained a Master of Science in Mental Health from the Chinese University of Hong Kong in 2014. He served as an occupational therapist in the Castle Peak Hospital for persons in recovery from 2009 to 2016. He joined SideBySide (previously named The Society of Rehabilitation and Crime Prevention, Hong Kong) in 2016 and worked as an occupational therapist for the Integrated Community Centre for Mental Wellness. He is currently the Senior Manager (Professional Service Development) overseeing the Occupational Therapy Service, Clinical Psychology Service, Talent Development Division, Research and Development Division and Chun Shek Halfway House. He was also one of the proposal writers for the Lighthouse Project - Pilot Project on Transitional Support Service for Persons in Mental Recovery.

Ms. Karen Yip Kalam

Ms. Karen Yip, the senior occupational therapist from the Mental Health Association of Hong Kong. She was graduated from the Hong Kong Polytechnic University Occupational Therapy program in 2005, and obtained her Master degree in Health Services Management and Master of Business Administration from HKPolyU in 2013 and 2016. She also get an award of Professional Diploma in occupational safety and health from the City University of Hong Kong in 2022. She had served as the occupational therapist in different non-government-organizations especially in the rehabilitation service. Clients with intellectual disabilities, physical disabilities and mental illnesses in hostels, day training centre, shelter workshop, support employment and outreach team were her serve targets in past. She started her management career in service development for mental disabilities since 2020, provided sharing and professional training for public in increasing the understanding and support for people with disabilities.

Mr. Arthur Au Wai Lun

Mr. Arthur Au was graduated from the Hong Kong Polytechnic in Professional Diploma of Occupational Therapy in 1992. He also obtained a Master of Social Science in Counseling from the University of South Australia, a Master of Science in Vocational Rehabilitation from the Hong Kong Polytechnic University and a Master of Business Administration from the Open University of Hong Kong. He had served as an occupational therapist in the Kwai Chung Hospital and the Duchess of Kent Children's Hospital for patients with mental illness and various spinal problems respectively from 1993 to 1998. He has joined the Vocational Training Council (VTC) since 1998 and had worked as the occupational Therapist for the Shine Skills Centre (Kwun Tong) till 2012. He is currently the Resource Manager of the Shine Technical Aids & Resource Centre of the Vocational Training Council serving students with various special educational needs in various campuses of VTC.

Mr. Raymond Lam Ming Wai

Mr. Raymond Lam serves as a supervisor of community services at New Life Psychiatric Rehabilitation Association. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Occupational Therapy from The Hong Kong Polytechnic University and a Master's degree in Social Sciences, specializing in Gerontology, from The University of Hong Kong. As a registered occupational therapist, he has accumulated extensive experience in clinical practice, administration, and management. Throughout his career, he has been involved in diverse services including Integrated Community Centres for Mental Wellness, Community Mental Health Intervention Project and Halfway Houses. Notably, he takes the lead in several funding projects for persons in mental recovery and their carers.

Ms. Janette Tam Hiu Yan

Ms. Janette Tam, overseas and coordinates various OT services and staff development at HOHCS. She has over 18 years of extensive clinical experience in various clinical settings, e.g. hospitals, non-government organizations, schools and self-financing settings, including District Support Center. Her clinical focus and expertise include sensory integration and processing, well-eating, OLSR, occupation-based neuro-and neurodevelopmental rehabilitation. Ms. Tam has pioneered and mobilized various pioneer services and projects, e.g. ASI® and Sensory Processing for elderly, adults and adolescents, therapeutic feeding and wean-off feeding-tube program (Joyful Dining Program) neuro-protective approach for people with dementia, OLSR Program for people with spasticity or chronic conditions (The ReLive Project) and the "Synergy" Approach for Case Management for people ASD (The My Way Project on Transition Care for People with ASD). She shared her experiences at various local and international conferences.

Ms. Rebecca Shiu Yuen Yung

Ms. Rebecca Shiu worked as an Occupational Therapist for 30 years. She completed professional diploma in Occupational Therapy from the HKPolyU and advanced her professional knowledge via the completion of advanced status of Dementia Mapper and Trainer status of Dementi-Ability Methods. She began her professional journey in United Christian Hospital and pioneered a project to develop a Specialized Dementia Care Unit in a residential care home for the Elderly, and established a 'Treasure Hunt' Memory Training Kit to enhance the well-being of the elderly in the community. Her extensive expertise has also been sought after, as she was appointed as the Occupational Therapy team leader for the Multi-disciplinary Outreaching Support Team for the Elderly (MOSTE) of New Territories West region. Currently, she is employed at Tuen Mun District Health Centre where focused on promoting a continuum of primary to tertiary care service.
