 - 5.1. Chief Editor reported that The HKJOT was indexed in the databases CINAHL, EMBASE, SCOPUS, and the Science Citation Index (SCI) (Web of Science) and PubMed since 1985
 - 5.2. HKJOT had an Impact Factor of 0.360 (2018) (ranked 131/134 in Rehabilitation), 5-Year Impact Factor: 0.542, CiteScore: 0.730, Source Normalized Impact per Paper (SNIP): 0.485 (2018), SCImago Journal Rank (SJR): 0.252 (2018)
 - 5.3. There were many submissions from countries in the world
 - 5.4. Chief Editor suggest to charge authors from other countries & maintain free of charge for papers coming from Hong Kong OT.

- 4. Events Organized from October 2018 to September 2019:
 - a. The World OT Day event on 24 November 2019 in Wong Tai Sin District with 25 OT volunteers and 125 OT students volunteers
 - b. The 40th Anniversary OT Conference and post conference workshop was organized on 12 January 2019 and 13 January 2019 with 190 and 19 attendances respectively. There was very good feedback on the programme.
 - c. A strategic planning workshop was organized on 19 January 2019 afternoon in the HK Polytechnic University. Representatives from all the SIGs attended the workshop and there were very fruitful discussion covering operation of the HKOTA to strategies for service development. We had done a SWOT analysis for HKOTA and proposed suggestions for improvement.
- 5. To streamline the administrative duties, our secretariat will only send out information on courses either organized or supported by HKOTA or offer very special discount for HKOTA members. Information on other relevant courses will only be uploaded on the web site.
- 6. A newsletter highlighting current events and updating SIG information was introduced starting from May 2019 to enhance communication with members. It will be issued quarterly.

- 7. The chairperson and executive committee member representatives had started visiting NGOs or OT related organizations in August 2019 to improve understanding of situation of OT in different organization and promote better linkage with them.
- 8. The Hong Kong Polytechnic University had generously offered \$20000 scholarship for HKOTA members to attend the Sixth International Institute on Kielhofner's Model of Human Occupation from 27-29 September 2019 in Chicago. 6 members were selected to attend with either paper or poster presented and finally 8 members attended the conference with the University's delegates.
- Executive Committee members had represented HKOTA to overseas conference with own financial support or minimal financial support from HKOTA
 - a. Occupational Therapy Australia 28th National Conference and Exhibition 2019 10-12 July 2019 in Sidney attended by Janette Tam
 - b. I-create Conference 2019 in Australia on 26-29 August 2019 attended by Simon Wong
 - c. OT Associations exchange meeting in Asian Region Cum Japanese OT Congress on 5-7 September
 2019 by Stella Cheng and presented a topic on Psychosocial OT Service in HK.
- 10. HKOTA had sent opinions to the following:
 - a. Response sent to HKSAR CE's Policy Address 2018 on 3 December 2018
 - b. Email sent to Joseph Lee on 10 March 2019 to express concern on healthcare manpower review
 - c. Sent a letter to HA Chief Executive in March 2019 and Meeting with Hospital Authority in May 2019 on OT Manpower, career progression and pay scale for OTs in HA
 - d. Rehabilitation Programme Plan Consultation starting from May 2019 in different locations
 - e. Attended briefing on District Health Center and provided HKOTA's opinions
- 11. A Survey for Private Practice OT was sent out in September 2019 to update our Private OT list on the web site. However, the return was low and only 24 OTs had returned. There is big implication, as the District Health Center will be referring to this list to search for OTs as network healthcare providers.

Targets Achieved for 2018/ 2019

- ➤ Planned and implemented seminars and workshops to advance professional practice. A total of 36 CPD programs were delivered and a total of 1,405 attendances were achieved during the period.

- ➢ 6 evening seminars were organized

CPD Plan for 2019/ 2020

- Formulated tentative CPD plans for 2019/2020
 - organize series of seminar 'Talk to Senior OT'
 - introduce 'Mentorship Program' on case/ skills supervision which had started from Paediatric, Mental Health (CBT), Ortho, M&G, etc

Proposal on Full Membership for Life (FMFL)

<u>Rationale</u>

- > To show recognition and appreciation to those senior members who has contributed to our profession
- > To keep contact with these senior members

<u>Criteria</u>

Must meet ALL of the following:

- > A Aged 60 or above
- > B Had been full member of HKOTA for 8 years since Year 14-15

Benefit

- ➤ No need to pay membership fee once FMFL status is confirmed
- > Enjoy all benefits as full member

Application

- > Need to send application to HKOTA
- > Need to send intention to continue status of active membership yearly (Could be e-form)
- > Purpose: Update information & control no. of Quorum

Examples as illustration

- > Scenario A- Aged 60 & had been HKOTA full member without break since Year 14-15
 - Eligible for FMFL in 22-23, need to pay membership fee until 21-22 (8 years since Year 14-15)
- > Scenario B- Aged 63 & had been HKOTA full member for 2 years since Year 14-15
 - Had to pay for 6 more years before eligible to apply for FMFL
- > Scenario C- Aged 35 and had been HKOTA full member since Year 14-15
 - Could only apply for HKOTA FMFL when reached 60 and proof had been full member for 8 years since Year 14-15
